Introduction

Public Administration and Policy – An Asia-Pacific Journal (PAP) was first launched and jointly published by HKPAA and City University of Hong Kong in 1992. It was suspended in 2005 due to the departure of the Editor-in-Chief. In spring 2012, it was re-launched with the support of the new co-publisher, the School of Professional Education and Executive Development (SPEED) of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (HK PolyU) and a new Editor-in-Chief.

This journal is devoted to the integration of theories and practice of public administration and management. It seeks to contribute to the improvements of the delivery and management of public services by highlighting issues, problems, and examples of efficient and innovative management practices by both public and private organizations in various continents of the world.

In order to keep published articles at a high academic quality and standard, an International Editorial Advisory Board consisting of renowned scholars from leading universities in the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, Switzerland, and Australia has been formed. In addition, an Asia-Pacific Editorial Board has also been set up with top academics from Hong Kong SAR, Mainland China, Taiwan, Singapore, South Korea, and Japan to focus on regional development issues.

The PAP Journal has progressed from print version to e-version and online in the past decade. It has published regular issues on various aspects of public administration as well as special issues on “Health Policies” and “Tertiary Education”. Since 2018, PAP has been published online in open access on the Emerald Insight Platform in the UK. PAP publishes three issues with at least one special issue per annum starting from 2020. It has published two special issues on Corruption Scandals in Six Asian Countries and Public Governance, Integrity, Performance and Inclusiveness in Asia in 2020, and a special issue on Regulatory Governance in a Globalizing World in 2021.

PAP is now abstracted and indexed by: Emerging Sources Citation Index (ESCI), CrossRef, EBSCO Discovery Service, Google Scholar, Health Research Premium Collection (ProQuest), Healthcare Administration Database (ProQuest), ProQuest Central ProQuest Central Basic (Korea), ProQuest Central Essentials, ProQuest Central Student, Publicly Available Content Database (ProQuest), Summons (ProQuest), and WorldCat.
